3 years ago, Andrew and I were welcoming people onto the beaches at the sunrise service with a team of people who had gotten up in the dark, stillness of night to carry crosses, set up sound, and freeze their feet off. As 6:00am started to creep up, so did the people. A few at first ... and then more ... and then, when we started the service at 6:00, that flow did not stop until there were hundreds of people on the beach. "Where did they all come from?" was the question I asked. "Where do they all park?!" seemed to be the question asked in response. The morning continued with 2 more services, and the 10:00 service was also beyond-my-imagination kind of full! With this being our third Easter here, we feel much more like a part of this community, and we know a little of what to expect on a week like Easter, but each year it still amazes us.



The thing that matters the most to us during Holy Week and Easter is the thing that matters every week; we don't know why so many choose to attend church on their vacation, but we have a few hunches. But, in reality, the reason they come doesn't matter. What does matter is what happens when they are with us. We pray that the Holy Spirit is palpable. We pray that that whatever preconceived notions about God or Church that people bring with them will be held loosely so there is freedom to explore what the Lord may want to awaken in the hearts of his people. We function at the Chapel because of Easter, and on Easter we function at the Chapel for the Hearts of those who either haven't tasted and seen that the Lord is good, or for those who have just forgotten how good God is.

If you worshipped with us through Holy Week or on Easter, and many of you did, we are grateful that you were with us and we pray that you were drawn closer to the Lord!

For our Maundy Thursday Service, we shared in communion and remembered the Passover meal together.

On Good Friday, Daniel Pratt, our worship leader, brought in cellist, Caleb Hernandez to lead along side of him. We ended Friday night having experienced something heavy and beautiful, and left on the edge of our seats as we were then



called to wait for Sunday... because it was only Friday and this day contained death, but "Sunday is coming."

Sunday morning the beach was packed with people freezing and excited. The morning was crisp, but that didn't stop the hundreds of people from showing up to sing, celebrate, and watch a dolphin show! Some of you scoffed at us for promoting the 8:30 service as the least attended service, and y'all, it still was with nearly 516 people there to worship. The always surprising service for us is that 10:00 (if you were there, you know!) had over 1,100 people in person. Again, we ask ourselves, "Where do they all come from?" followed quickly with the obvious question, "Where do they all park!".

Over the course of Holy week, we were able to worship with nearly 3,000 of you. Regardless of where you came from and where you parked, we hope you felt welcome with us!
