There are book recommendations and if you haven't walked through the curriculum from Practicing the Way, we HIGHLY recommend you take advantage of it. We are beyond grateful for the work of <u>Practicing the Way</u> and the <u>Bible Project</u> for resources that are free, beautiful, and full of TRUTH.

First of all, if you haven't read either <u>Practicing the Way</u>, or <u>Ruthless Elimination of Hurry</u> by John Mark Comer. These are 2 books that Andrew and I will continue to recommend until you inform us that everyone has read them and we should stop telling you that you should!

This last January I was working through a study with She Reads Truth called <u>Everything New.</u> It was such a beatuiful look at God restoring and redeeming all things. At the same time, My parents were visiting and I picked up a book my mom had with her that a friend had given her. It was called, <u>Imagine Heaven</u> by John Burke. This book, frankly, got me excited about Heaven and I felt like I could Imagine Heaven in a way that was more glorious than I could have ever considered. I mentioned this to a friend who suggested that I check out <u>Room of Marvels</u> by James Bryan Smith. If you are suffering grief from losing someone, or would love to take a walk through a fictional work that came out of someone's contemplative time with God, you should pick it up. It was a quick read and I loved it. If you are interested in other stories like these, check out <u>The Great Divorce</u> by CS. Lewis.

If you want something that will take you on a culinary journey through important foods mentioned in scripture, read <u>Taste and See</u> by Margaret Feinberg. It is so fun and a light read!
