PODCAST

Building projects to begin shortly!

We will begin two big building projects at The Chapel soon. The financially larger of the two projects is to replace ALL of the windows at The Chapel. In case you haven't noticed, after almost 25 years, more than ½ of The Chapel's beautiful windows have extensive wood rot damage; the damage is so extensive, that we can no longer patch and repair the windows. In addition, the current windows are single pane and not hurricane rated. We have been working with The Chapel's original architect (Scott Merrill) on the best replacement strategy. The new windows will be "clad construction" which should last much longer, and the windows will be hurricane rated. We are coordinating with the contractor to ensure minimal disruption to the operations of The Chapel. This project will start on January 2nd and, hopefully, finish in February. The contractor will clean up each Friday and Saturday to enable Sunday services.

The Chapel will be open for services every Sunday during construction.

In addition to the window replacement project, we will be making improvements to the property on the west side of The Chapel in order to create a space that will be helpful for families with children too young for Kids Church. The design will allow these families to attend the services without worrying about their children running into the street or feeling pressure to keep them quiet. We believe this place for families with toddlers to worship in a defined space will help to form community with one another and ease the worry of disturbing visitors while keeping their kids safe. In the future, this space could also be used to host our toddler Kids Church. The space will be finished with a small wall (to contain and protect the children and mirror the design of east side of the building), grass and benches. This project will begin as soon as Walton County issues the building permits, and it may be done concurrently with the window project.

The Board is pleased that we can proceed with both projects ... one that is absolutely necessary for our physical building, and the other project that should make Sunday worship more conducive for young families which we believe is necessary for the future growth of our community.

As you might imagine, the window project is very expensive ... just over \$500,000; the improvements to the west side will be approximately \$75,000. Because of the generosity of those who support The Chapel, we will be able to pay for all of the work out of our capital reserves – but, this will be a significant drain on those reserves.

So, I ask that as you consider your year-end giving, please keep The Chapel in mind. It would be wonderful to build back our monetary reserves after completing these important projects.



One of our favorite books this year was The Paradise King: The Tragic History and Spectacular Future of Everything According to **Jesus of Nazareth**


by Blaine Eldridge. It reads like a novel and a history book. Its amazing.
