FEB 16TH - SEASIDE RACE DAY CHURCH AND PARKING INFORMATION

February 16th is the <u>Seaside School Half Marathon.</u> and 5k. This is a super fun Sunday in Seaside!

It is a Sunday, which means, we still have church at 10:00. This is the most casual Sunday ever as we participate and then have church - it's really fun, I promise!

There will be no programming for kids this day.

Here are things you need to know:

PARKING IN SEASIDE® WILL BE AVAILABLE EXCLUSIVELY TO PARKING PASS HOLDERS ON RACE DAY.

For Race Day, all SEASIDE® entry points from 30A and 395 will be closed, and only those with a valid pass will be permitted to enter. Each intersection and point of entry will be manned and this policy will be strictly enforced.

PLEASE NOTE THE 30A ROAD CLOSURE AT 6:00 AM ON RACE

If you aren't participating, but you can't stay away, here is your **SHUTTLE OPTION**

Complimentary parking and shuttle services are available from Emerald Coast Middle School Shuttles will run from Emerald Coast Middle School to SEASIDE® from 4:45 AM to 3:30 PM CST. The last pick up from SEASIDE® will be at the corner of Quincy and 30A at 3:30 PM CST.

"HOW DOES THE CHAPEL WORK?"

You know you have asked this question! Everyone has! We have a lot of new faces around here, so we thought it was about time to reintroduce you to the ways of The Chapel. This month we are starting with the govering body...The Board! And to tell you about it is our Board Chair, Mike Cross.



MIKE CROSS

Mike Cross has been our Board Chair since June 2022. Mike and his wife Cynthia have been SEASIDE homeowners since 2015. They have vacationed down here for decades with their two sons; Michael Jr. (wife Annie and two daughters) and William (wife Maddie). Mike and Cynthia spend part of the year in Memphis - but, they spend some of the year here in SEASIDE.

HOW THE CHAPEL OPERATES

The Chapel at Seaside is led by a Board of Directors, and I have been blessed to serve as the Chairman for the last two years. The Board currently has six members, and our bylaws state that in order to serve on the Board one has to own property in SEASIDE. However, we recognized that The Chapel serves a broader community in the area – so, a few years ago, we added Advisory members to the Board from Watercolor, Seagrove and other neighboring communities. While Advisory members cannot officially vote, their voices are heard as we make decisions for The Chapel. The Board meets once a quarter.

Because we are a unique non-denominational church that represents regular worshipers across the Christian denominational spectrum, the process for governance is not predetermined as it would be if we were part of the Presbyterian, Baptist or Methodist churches (for example). The Chapel has bylaws, which give the Board several responsibilities. First, the Board is responsible for calling a Pastor. We are very, very fortunate that the previous Board called Andrew Beard; we are blessed by having the Beards serving at The Chapel. The Board is also responsible for making the final decisions on staffing for other areas (Children's church, worship leader, sound & lighting, etc.) and, the Board is also responsible for budgeting, approving major projects (like window replacement), and for ensuring that we have proper insurance.

Even though we are not "elders" or "deacons", as some denominations use as their leadership structure, the Board does thoughtfully and prayerfully work through, pray through, examine and approve documents like our Statement of Faith, which is available on the website, and we are involved in approving and suggesting programming for the life of the Church – for example, our approach to small groups.

Finally, the Board should be available to listen to suggestions and concerns from others attending The Chapel and those who call The Chapel home.

This governance structure is a partnership between the Pastor, staff, board, and advisory members to lead this congregation and community well.

BOB GLASGOW


