# It's Been Pretty Beautiful

This time of year, our family challenges each other to look back. We ask questions like: What were your favorite moments? Your favorite trips? What do you hope we do again next year? These moments of reflection and gratitude are good for us mentally, emotionally, and spiritually.

God's people have always practiced this kind of remembering. The Hebrew people looked back to recall the ways God moved powerfully among them. The early church reflected on the life and teachings of Jesus and the work accomplished through the Spirit. And today, each time we gather, we remember what God has done, the steps taken in faith, the risks embraced, and the ways lives have been shaped through this ministry called The Chapel. Our hope is that reflection doesn't simply make us feel good (though that's not a bad thing), but that it inspires us to keep participating in the transforming work of God, on earth as it is in heaven.

Here are just a few highlights from this past year:

- **We welcomed Nate Kelly as our new worship leader**, who has brought a diversity of musical talent to accompany him in leading worship. The participation in worship has continued to grow, standing in this lovely space that honors the great traditions of hymns and modern songs that invites all to make a joyful noise to the Lord.
- **Our Next Generation Ministry, led by Michael Pratt, officially launched a youth group with Sunday morning gatherings, weekly meetups, and fun social events that build community and faith for middle and high school students.**
- What was once a somewhat forgotten space on the west side of The Chapel has been transformed into a welcoming, **semi-contained gathering area for families with toddlers, making Sunday mornings just a little easier and a lot more joyful for young families.**
- **Kids Church continues to thrive**, with more children and volunteers helping the next generation know and follow Jesus.
- **We launched Chapel 101**, offering people a deeper understanding of who we are, what we believe, and where we're headed, along with a meaningful step toward commitment as Chapel Affiliates. We have 50 people who have become Affiliate Members of The Chapel.
- **We have 121 people in Chapel Communities** who are learning what it looks like to live out their faith together.
- **We continued giving more than 25% of our budget away**, partnering with about 20 organizations, both local and global, to proclaim the gospel through both word and deed, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, caring for the vulnerable, supporting those reentering society, and loving children and families in need.



- **We're nearly finished updating our windows**, an important project that strengthens the building, improves energy efficiency, and protects this sacred space for generations to come.
- **We celebrated many baptisms this year**, including our first official beach baptism and bonfire, where 12 people, including an entire family, were baptized. We also dedicated two little ones to the faith that evening.
- Most importantly, **this year, we had 30 people who committed to faith for the first time, experienced the life-giving salvation Jesus offers, or recommitted their lives to following Him.**
- We gave away 600 Lenten guides and 600 Advent guides, **helping people journey with Jesus through the rhythms of the church year.**
- **We've seen continued growth in our podcast**, sermon reach, Chapel Study Notes, and online worship, alongside in-person worship where we see on an average Sunday, about 300 people gather here, plus kids, youth...and a few dogs.
- We have also bore witness to The Chapel being filled with people desiring deeper relationship with the Lord, growing in their personal discipleship, and making decisions to follow Jesus more closely effecting change in their lives and the lives around them.

This has been a truly beautiful year of ministry, and I'm deeply grateful to each of you who calls The Chapel home. None of this happens without you. Thank you for your support, your generosity, your participation, and your presence.

As we look ahead, I hope you'll continue to stay involved; serving, giving, worshiping, and helping make the world look a little more like the Kingdom of Heaven.

# A second service is coming... here is what you might want to know.

If you've worshiped with us at The Chapel anytime between about March 1st and January 1st...and you didn't arrive by roughly 9:45...there's a pretty good chance you ended up sitting outside.

Now, The Chapel is in a beautiful place. The Grove and the Lawn are lovely. The weather is often incredible. And let's be honest, outdoor worship is especially great if you brought your dog.

With that being said...

The Chapel only seats about 175 people indoors (and that is with some squeezing). During our busy seasons, it's not uncommon for 300–400 people to show up for worship on a Sunday morning.

So after lots of conversations, lots of prayer and reflection, lots of trying to squeeze people under the patio on rainy Sundays, lots of handing out water bottles and fans on hot summer days, and lots of saying, "I'm so sorry—The Chapel is full," we've realized something:

After five years, and a growing community of locals, along with many who love worshipping here when they're in town, we need to make some room.

The best way to do that?

We're starting a second service.

**Here's what that will look like:**

- **We're keeping the 10:00am service exactly the same** (because people love it).
- **We're adding an 8:30am service**, identical to the 10:00am service.
- **Both services will be 60 minutes or less.**
- **There will be a 30-minute transition time between services;** a chance to see one another, say hello, and keep building community.
- **Children and youth programming will continue at the 10:00am service only**, held at Seaside Neighborhood School, just like always.
- **This all begins Sunday, February 22nd.**
- **We'll continue offering communion on the first Sunday of the month, shared between the two services at 9:35.**







# Help Make the Second Service Work

To make a second service work well, we'll need a little help from you. First, we need people to attend the 8:30am service.

This won't solve every space issue overnight, but if we can take some of the weight off the 10:00am service, it will make a huge difference—especially on hot, cold, or rainy days. If you're willing to make 8:30 your regular worship time, it would be a real gift to our community.

Second, we need people to serve.

If you don't currently volunteer, this is a great moment to jump in. Since kids and youth programming happens at 10:00 a.m., many people could attend one service and serve during the other.

We're genuinely excited about this next step. We believe this will help us be more welcoming and more hospitable to everyone who wants to worship at The Chapel.

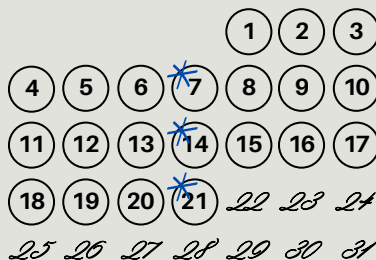
Nate will be there to lead us in a time of worship as we gather to pray.
